Festival for sonic exploration and digital art

Using different formats and forms, New Salt condenses style-influencing musical and aesthetic positions and, in doing so, places a focus on interdisciplinary and multimedia projects. The centre will be formed by concerts, sound installations and audiovisual works that incorporate established locations and take place within new frameworks that are still to be discovered. New Salt sees itself as a platform for exchange and communication, as a social space and a connecting element between artists and interested parties. Artist residencies and workshops held in participatory open formats will create points of connection and search for sustainable synergies. Using multiple levels and over the course of about a year, New Salt builds a bridge from contemporary composition to avant-garde electronica all the way to contemporary forms of guitar and danceable club music, while opening up spaces for discussion and expanding points of view.

Salzkammer Hall / (Salzkammer(sc)hall) A four-part sound-land-art project with choirs, music bands, "Prangerschütz*innen" and bells from the Salzkammergut

The project consists of four strands, which will take place at different times throughout the year. Four sound pillars of the culture of the Salzkammergut - which are at the same time clichés - will, with the use of the triedand-true, be continued into the future in a fresh and sustainable way. A new perspective on the tried-and-true and allegedly stable should be experienced not as a provocation but as an expansion of perception through the combination of a sensory activity with what is familiar. It is designed for participants including audiences and people who only hear about it by chance or in passing. It is intended more as a euphoric and minimalistic posing of exciting questions rather than a thoroughly choreographed collection of remarks and displacements of "what has always been there". Clichés will become material and serve as the tools for their own transcendence and new interpretation.

Georg Nussbaumer is known as a virtuosic artistic all-rounder whose work moves between composition, installation art, performance and theatre. Nussbaumer works with highly specialised performers and musicians just as easily as he works with bow hunters, free divers, a motorcycle club or groups of hundreds of singers in rural amateur choirs

The Slow Shot

Salzkammer Hall / Sound 2

Loud in the landscape: a temporary acoustic relief of the entire Salzkammergut made up of hundreds of shots. For the four-part project Salzkammer Hall, the entire Salzkammergut will simultaneously become the starting point, the material, the content and the stage, geographically as well as culturally. In The Slow Shot (der langsame Schuss), pillory shooters will stand in two straight lines through the Salzkammergut and will each fire one after the other. Each crack of every shot will interact with the landscape in a different way; one hears the shots and their echoes come closer and then disappear again. The lines from Donnerkogel to Unterhörbach and from Hollerberg to Knallstein cross in Bad Ischl.

The Sung Horizon

Salzkammer Hall / Sound 3

The mountain panorama at Offensee as an imposing vocal line of slowly rotating choirs. For the four-part project Salzkammer Hall, the entire Salzkammergut simultaneously becomes the starting point, the material, the content and the stage, geographically as well as culturally. The Sung Horizon (der gesungene Horizont) takes Mahler's claim to have "composed the mountains away" literally, much like Hans Gielge's theory that the melody lines of yodels trace mountain panoramas. The line of the horizon at Offensee will become the notation and thus the sounding line that will be "sung" together. Slowly, the voices will follow the rising crests, fall over the peaks and edges, and remain stable on the horizontal ridges.

The Landscape Organ Salzkammer Hall / Sound 4

The audience wanders through mighty soundscapes, which are released by up to 300 brass musicians into the landscapes of Altaussee and the Vorchdorf gravel pit in the late afternoon on two of the three scheduled Saturdays (ensuring an alternative date in case of bad weather).

For the four-part project Salzkammer Hall, the entire Salzkammergut simultaneously becomes the starting point, the material, the content and the stage, geographically as well as culturally. As The Landscape Organ (die Landschaftsorgel), brass musicians transform themselves in a valley basin and a gravel quarry into a polyphonous organ that can emit powerful sounds just as much as it can create dryly popping sounds, tender clouds of trills or shining major chords. The sounds overlay and displace one another and return as echoes. The changing audience immerses itself in the dynamic depths of the sounds and silences. Each audience member will hear something different.

Ballet Mécanique Sound traces of the avant-garde

The Salzkammergut was a melting pot of the avant-garde in the 19th and 20th centuries. The performance and exhibition of the Ballet Mécanique tie in with this tradition and at the same time offer a Salzkammergut version of this visionary masterpiece of classical modernism.

In 2019, visual artist Peter Kogler and curator Katrin Bucher-Trantow initiated a reinterpretation of the legendary Ballet Mécanique by American composer George Antheil for Kogler's Connected exhibition at the Kunsthaus Graz. The Graz composer Winfried Ritsch subsequently realised this music machine.

In the 1920s, at the height of the industrial revolution, George Antheil was inspired with the idea of having his Ballet Mécanique played by a machine orchestra. Eight drums, seven bells, a siren, seven aeroplane propellers and up to sixteen pianolas – player pianos that were already in widespread use at the time – were supposed to realise this, but he failed in the technical implementation. He finally showed an alternative version with two pianists and one pianola in a slower tempo during the first performance in Paris, provoking a much-noticed scandal. A year later, it led to a fiasco in the United States. But his idea lives on and continues to inspire artists and audiences alike. One hundred years after the creation of the Ballet Mécanique, it is now being performed – according to the latest findings in the originally intended version by Antheil and synchronised with the 1924 version of the film of the same name by Fernand Léger – in the Lehár Theater.

Water Sound Flows Sound colours of nature

Thomas Grill and his team connect the places of the region by presenting the sounds of water in different forms using various artistic strategies.

Through compositional and performative activities in Bad Ischl, Bad Goisern and Grundlsee, with different – sometimes unorthodox – methods of acoustic recording and propagation, a network of sound streams is created over hills and through valleys.

The sound is transformed, takes on colours, tastes and smells, absorbs impurities and leaves behind residues – just like water flowing through a landscape. Workshops, installations and concert performances make it possible to participate and immerse oneself in the water-sound currents.

Everything Already Composed Away Mahler and Gulda in Steinbach

The opening of the Salon Gulda, a Gustav Mahler voyage on the "Floating Artists' Salon" and a concert with Mahler's impressive Symphony No. 2.

Gustav Mahler's second symphony "Resurrection" was intended to go beyond any known format and deal with great questions of meaning. Also known as the "Resurrection Symphony", its overwhelming sonority allows us to understand the composer's existential struggle. In the first part of the concert on 1 June, the exceptional young talent Emilian Schmid will play Friedrich Gulda's Cello Concerto. The piano virtuoso and composer Gulda, who spent many summers at Attersee, will be honoured on 15 May with the opening of the new Salon Gulda at Hotel Föttinger – a lively music space for young pianists. On 29 May, a Gustav Mahler voyage with experts on the "Floating Artists' Salon" will introduce Symphony No. 2, which will be performed as an orchestral concert with choir in the Steinbach Hall.

Opening and concert

The opening of the Salon Gulda at the Hotel Föttinger will be celebrated with a concert by Paul Gulda together with his students. As a homage to his father Friedrich Gulda, whose birthday was on 16 May, he will play his music and other works by great masters such as Bach, Mozart, Mahler and Schönberg the day before.

The piano virtuoso and composer Friedrich Gulda (1930–2000) is considered one of the most versatile and innovative musicians of the 20th century. His life and work at Attersee will be honoured with the opening of the new concert format "Salon Gulda – a lively music room for young pianists". For the eve of Friedrich Gulda's birthday, his son Paul has prepared a colourful programme. He and some of his best students will play and sing. The idols Bach, Mozart and Beethoven are not to be missed, and there will also be works by Gulda(s), improvised pieces, and short excursions to Bruckner, Mahler and Schönberg justified by time and place. Pleasure, excitement and a touching experience are guaranteed. As Friedrich Gulda himself wished, the music stays young and plays on . . .

Church.Sound.Space (*Kirch.Klang.Raum*) Music with history and the present

Under the direction of Martin Haselböck, the Church Sounds Festival (*Kirch'Klang Festival*) fills the venerable spaces of the Salzkammergut with innovative content, familiar and brand-new sounds, and unusual formats.

Together with the European Capital of Culture Bad Ischl Salzkammergut 2024, the new programming format Church. Sound. Space opens itself up to free spaces of improvisation. New perspectives on sound will be opened in the Ausseerland region with the star violinist Benjamin Schmid and his reflections on Johann Sebastian Bach. The season will also come to a close there with an open improvisation workshop and a concert.

In Bad Ischl, the newly restored Bruckner organ in the parish church will become the centre and highlight of the programming: not only will the Bruckner anniversary be celebrated in extraordinary harmony on this impressive instrument but the call for the first "Organ Moves!" Tradition in Transition - Quantum Leaps: JIM Linz (Part 2)

Under the direction of Martin Stepanik, JIM Linz and its students and professors are searching for "quantum leaps" in the artistic development of jazz with the active support of "local heroes" Anna Lang and Alois Eberl.

The thesis that the artistic development in European jazz is not continuous but rather takes place in quantum leaps in which new stages of development are reached seemingly out of "nothing" will be investigated in a two-year research project at the JIM (Institute for Jazz and Improvised Music of the Anton Bruckner Private University Linz). The concerts on 13 June, 2024 (Jugendzentrum YOUZ Bad Ischl) and 14 June, 2024 (Agrarbildungszentrum Altmünster, hosted by Anna Lang SeeTonWellen Festival Altmünster) are a "final report" on the project.

The performers are teachers, students and alumni from the JIM. The two renowned Salzburgers Christian Kronreif and Fabian Rucker studied in Linz and have now returned to the JIM as professors of jazz saxophone. Martin Stepanik is the "mastermind" behind the whole idea. This time, in Part 2, the two local heroes Anna Lang and Alois Eberl enrich the project. Lang's duo Sinfonia de Carneval has received many awards, and both artists are internationally active and successful in a wide variety of formations: Lang as composer, cellist, director, pianist and recently as concert organiser (SeeTonWellen Festival Almünster); Eberl as a trombone and accordion virtuoso and with his new quartet Alpha Trianguli, among others. Most recently, both were guests of the Jazzfreunde with the brand new "sinfonic art pop and jazz" Blob Pop Scrap Quintet.

Anna Lang and Alois Eberl have been among the most promising representatives of the younger jazz generation for years. (OÖN)

Attwenger goes Dachstein Concert at lofty heights

The duo Attwenger, from Urfahr near Linz, is sympathetically unclassifiable – and they have been for more than 30 years. Their origins can be found in folk music as well as in the alternative band scenes of the 1990s. Goisern Music Days for Contemporary Music Music and ecology

Within the scope of the newly conceived Goisern Music Days (*Goiserer Musiktage*), the state music school, which has successfully conducted master classes and workshops for three decades, is turning to contemporary music for the first time

Silent Echoes: Dachstein

A sound installation between Notre-Dame Cathedral and the Dachstein ice caves

The US artist Bill Fontana is developing a sound sculpture as an artistic statement on the consequences of climate change.

In 2019, Notre-Dame Cathedral, "the soul of Paris" and a landmark of European culture, burns. The bells are spared but fall silent for years. Silently they "listen" to the hustle and bustle of the city and the sounds of the construction site. The US sound artist Bill Fontana makes the harmonic response of the bells audible through vibration sensors, transmits the sounds into the ice caves on the Dachstein and mirrors them as if in a duet with the sounds of the melting glacier, an impressive artistic statement on climate change and the fragility of culture. This site-specific duet will be the basis of a "sound bridge" that will be sent to other exhibition sites in Europe and beyond.

The Parzival Dome in the Dachstein Giant Ice Cave is a place that holds an inestimable secret, as it is called in Anton Bruckner's composition Locus Iste. This secret asks us the question of how we want to live with nature in the future. In addition, the Upper Austrian KulturEXPO Anton Bruckner 2024, in cooperation with the Bad Goisern Music Days (*Goiserer Musiktage*), will award a composition commission to young composers on this theme. The work will be premiered as part of the European Capital of Culture Bad Ischl Salzkammergut 2024 during the Bad Goisern Music Days on the glass fountain in the ice cave.
