The Big Green Project Climate Protection at the European Level – Artistic and Cultural Embedding

The Creative Europe-funded project "The Big Green Project" is being realized by the cultural sector in collaboration with over 20 international partners. It addresses green topics, both utopian and dystopian. Theaters, research institutions, art collectives, and cultural capitals are joining forces in a large green initiative to artistically and culturally embed and support the climate transition. In our decade, where everything is at stake, it is time for all sectors to act and contribute to climate protection by strengthening efforts toward climate security, resilience building, prevention, and preparedness. All sectors should play their part and find their own path to sustainable growth. Numerous pieces of evidence show a fundamental connection between cultural practices and the greening of our societies. Culture plays a crucial role in driving societal change and fostering innovation. In this context, the cultural and creative sector (CCS) should play a leading role in the green transformation of our society. However, the full potential of the culture and creative industries to drive the green transition in Europe has not yet been fully realized.

How can this full potential be tapped and unleashed for the green transition? How can the transition within the cultural and creative sector be facilitated, and how can it inspire change outside the sector? In the "The Big Green" project, numerous partners from across Europe have come together to find answers to these questions and to align, amplify, and bundle efforts toward a green transition through large-scale collaboration. The long-term vision of the project is to change the utility perception of the cultural and creative sector by promoting its new role in the context of the green transition in Europe.

Salzkammerqueer **Queer Communities in Rural Areas**

Despite increasing visibility and the reduction of stereotypical representations of queer characters in cinema and television productions, LGBTIQ* individuals still face both overt and subtle expressions of prejudice and rejection in their everyday lives. To foster the exchange of experiences among like-minded individuals and seekers in rural areas, the women's support centers are contributing to the establishment of a queer community in the Salzkammergut with this project. By connecting with existing initiatives and best practices in rural areas (e.g., dorfpride.de), and offering events and regular meetups at various locations throughout the Salzkammergut, the project aims to create networking opportunities. The goal is to initially provide an active community with a home base and infrastructure that will last beyond the project duration. The second goal is an experimental short film series and artistic photography positions that will share queer life in the Salzkammergut via social media.

Children's University Salzkammergut An Exploratory Journey into the World of Tomorrow

As part of a participatory, cross-state project, a children's theater play will be developed based on a series of educational and creative workshops, to be performed with children in Bad Aussee in the summer of 2024. The workshops will focus on questions related to nature, the environment, climate change, and biodiversity. Children's responses to these questions will be collected audiovisually and integrated into the play. In parallel creative workshops, the stage set and design will be developed and created. The highlight of the project will be the multi-day preparations and the performance of the children's play in July 2024. The project will include about 10 Children's University workshops (held in schools or at open events) for children aged 6–12, designed according to the principles of inquiry-based learning. Children will develop their own questions on topics such as the Salzkammergut region and global sustainability and explore multidimensional answers through various methods (observation, collection, experience, etc.). Professional artists will support the children in creative workshops as they work on the play, particularly in the creation of the stage design, video sequences, and parts of the music.

Drawing a Thread - Textile Identity Connection Points

The former weaving and spinning mill in Ebensee is the focal point of this project, which addresses the history of women's* work, assigned roles, social achievements, and controversies. Artistic positions engage with these themes, focusing on women's* labor, textile art, herstory, and artistic research. Ebensee on Lake Traun is a place with a textile heritage. Soda, clock, and textile factories, along with the salt pans of the Saline, shaped the identities of the workers and connected them through international trade with Europe and the world. The focal point of the project ""Drawing a Thread" is the former Ebensee weaving and spinning mill, whose influence is still felt today. The factory was not just a place of work, but also a hub for community life. At the height of its activity, it formed a microcosm, with necessary social institutions like childcare, consumer cooperatives, and even small-scale agriculture for self-sufficiency. Women made up a large portion of the workforce and had the opportunity to earn their own income through the childcare provided. Despite these social innovations, life and work were tough, and hierarchies were clearly distributed: men* as supervisors, women* as textile workers. During World War II, forced laborers were also used in production. The factory finally closed in 1992, but many stories and myths still surround the operation. These stories, along with many contradictions and entanglements, are brought to the surface, reconnected, and presented by international and regional artists, in collaboration with the Ebensee Fashion School and the local population. Together, they will explore traditional textile raw materials from the Salzkammergut region, such as flax, sheep's wool, and old textiles. The exchange of traditional knowledge and the promotion of craft skills will be made possible through workshops, lectures, exhibitions, and a handicraft roundtable. This networking among textile actors within the framework of this project will create new structures and serve as the basis for the TEXTILE FORUM SALZKAMMERGUT.

The *Drawing a Thread" project builds on a research project about the history of women in the Ebensee weaving and spinning industry, conducted by the Frauenforum Salzkammergut in collaboration with the University of Salzburg from 2017–2018. A key finding of this project, based on interviews and storytelling cafes, was that the textile factory strongly influenced the social and cultural life of the town. As part of the "Drawing a Thread" project, artists and craftspeople are invited to explore the town's textile history by researching three traditional textile raw materials from the Salzkammergut: flax, sheep wool, and old textiles. The insights gained through art and craft will be presented in the final exhibition *Textile Visions in the Salzkammergut*.

The Temporal Forest & woodpassage This project offers a detour into the ecology of forests, examining time from ultralong to ultrashort perspectives.

The environmental artist Jonathon Keats has developed a process for capturing ultra-long photographic exposures using specially designed cameras. At the same time, SEEC Photography has developed a method for capturing ultra-fast videos that show the movement of light over everyday objects with exposure times of less than one billionth of a second. The combination of these two time scales offers a unique perspective on the global, human-constructed conditions of living on Earth. Decisions made in an instant can have far-reaching consequences for the environment over centuries. This is especially true for forestry, which has a direct connection to global warming. "Temporal Forest" aims to illustrate the ecology of the forest and forestry practices in the context of a concept of time. A camera will be installed on a mountain peak in the Salzkammergut, overlooking a landscape that has been heavily shaped by salt mining and industry over the last few centuries. An attached plaque will reference the 1,000-year exposure time and encourage hikers to view the environment from the long-term perspective of trees.

An indoor installation at the Galerie im Brauhof in Scharnstein will show films in which light moves at the speed of light over a tree, wood, and forestry tools. With exposure times of less than one billionth of a second, these films illustrate the dynamics crucial for photosynthesis on a time scale that differs by 20 orders of magnitude from the 1,000-year exposures. The moment when humans make decisions – decisions that can affect the next few centuries – lies exactly between these two scales. These installations therefore highlight the necessity of thinking beyond the natural human time horizon – a challenge that has never been more urgent than today. Accompanying the project is a brochure that sheds light on the historical relationship between wood and the European salt industry and provides a map leading to the millennium camera in the Alps.

woodpassage - From Tree to House in 40 Steps

In the forest, a tree grows – the tree becomes wood – and from the wood, a house is built. The *woodpassage* powerfully brings this process as an "outdoor wood sculpture" to the Salzkammergut cultural capital region. Using simple pictogrammatic symbols, the passage illustrates the transformation from tree to house in 40 stages. This transformation is portrayed as if carved from large wooden blocks, slice by slice. The result is a tangible *woodpassage* composed of four wooden gates, each approximately 4 meters wide, 4 meters high, and totaling 5 meters in length. From a distance, it conveys a strong three-dimensional message. Walking through the illuminated passage, it becomes a playful advocate for the ecological benefits of using wood and timber construction.

It creates an impression that goes beyond the everyday human time horizon.

Acta Liquida

Fish Culture and Climate Change

Acta Liquida is a transdisciplinary art project by three artists that connects the Traunsee, climate change, history, and memory, focusing on fish culture.

Heidi Zednik abstracts natural processes of the deepest lake in the Salzkammergut: decades of collected filter material from the Altmünster fish hatchery are installed, showcasing changes in weather, sediments, and pollutants. These are complemented by drawings, prints, and objects. The audiovisual installation *"Memories of an Extincting Kind"* by multimedia artist Elza Grimm addresses species and habitat changes in Central European freshwater bodies due to climate and other human-induced transformations. The installation consists of multiple individual hologram and sound elements, with the core piece being the projection of an experimental short film. The beauty and grace of the Reinanke, a fish species native to the Traunsee, serve as the inspiration for the form and movement in the installation, depicted in 3D animations from various perspectives and life stages.

Siegfried Holzbauer's analog photos, double-exposed, and associative texts trace diverse processes and memories related to the Traunsee and its fish. His *Stanglfisch* installations highlight the impact of climate change on the fish species in the Traunsee. The exhibition is held simultaneously in two locations. Heidi Zednik and Elza Grimm present their works and installations in the exhibition at the Aurachmühle, Neukirchen; Siegfried Holzbauer complements them with some of his photos. The exhibition at Seeschloss Ort, Gmunden, features Siegfried Holzbauer's installations and photos.



The garden as an open learning space: By 2024, contemporary artists, in collaboration with students, experts, and initiatives, will transform the outdoor areas around the HLW Bad Ischl into a learning environment. From the kitchen meadow to the classroom in the open air: Since 2022, students from the HLW Bad Ischl, a higher school for economics, social work, and health, have been involved in the design of a garden on the school

SOLENAUT*INNEN

The International Sole Spaceport (ISR) in Bad Ischl makes space travel accessible to all

The SOLENAUT*INNEN project redefines the experience of space and Earth for its visitors. For one month, Bad Ischl will host a unique opportunity for solenautic spaceflights, combining a full-dome 18-meter structure with a saline floating installation. Visitors will float in concentrated salt brine, immersing themselves in the silence of space. The floating effect, due to the high buoyancy of the warm brine, induces a sensation of weightlessness and deep relaxation, heightening the immersive effect of high-definition 360° space voyage projections.

The International Sole Spaceport integrates advanced technology with architecture, featuring a saline floating facility within a geodesic dome (Fulldome). The precision of video projections, perfectly adapted to the environment, makes this installation the first of its kind globally, now open to the public in Bad Ischl.

Floating in the Fulldome

Floating is a relaxation technique in which one floats in a warm saline pool, isolated from external stimuli. This technique promotes deep physical and mental relaxation, often used in medical, therapeutic, and wellness contexts, helping achieve deep meditative states. The brine concentration used is comparable to that of the Dead Sea (30%), far higher than typical thermal baths (3%). The brine used in the Sole Spaceport comes directly from nearby Altaussee. The Fulldome also features specially developed space films, simulating a 3D perception with a 4K 360° projection system using five Barco Laser-Phosphor projectors. This high-quality technology ensures clear visuals regardless of weather conditions.



Microfarmers Conference Smallholder Pathways for the Agriculture of the Future

The Microfarmers Conference aims to address the tensions within the current agricultural reality between romanticization and existential threats. Through direct contact at community events and the conference itself, these issues will be examined. Conflicts over land use between agriculture, tourism, and conservation lead to soaring land prices and micro-land grabbing. The conference will explore how to halt the sell-off of agriculture and discuss existing models in other countries regarding fair compensation for farming work. The relationship between direct marketing and stringent legal requirements often results in the criminalization of traditional farming practices. Sensitive topics like slaughtering on small farms, lack of farm succession, and debt are frequently omitted from discourse. The goal is to talk about the diversity in agricultural culture and farming. Community living models and non-family farm transfers will be highlighted, alongside queer rural life. Engaging the next generation in this process is crucial to providing them with future perspectives in agriculture, particularly as this sector is one of the most affected by aging in Austria.

Community Events These events will take place at seven farms throughout 2023 and spring 2024, facilitating discussions on the differences in farming culture and agriculture, community living models, and queer rural life.
